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The Church Schools' Leadership Programme

Nearly two years ago a group of local Church School headteachers met to discuss the issue of how we could develop the next generation of faith school leaders. It became clear that we needed to do something and from that was born the Church Schools' Leadership Programme. This initiative is the only one of its type in Wales and we believe is unique in the UK. It's unique because it is for both primary and secondary schools and it is supported by the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Cardiff and the Diocese of Menevia and the Church in Wales Dioceses of Llandaff, Monmouth, Swansea and Brecon and St David's. Our programme was not meant to replicate existing leadership courses but to be something different – to develop the specific skills and vision that make Church Schools distinctive. Starting in 2016 with 47 participants in our first cohort and now with 56 in our second, the programme is one of the largest supported by the three education consortia in South Wales. Teachers from Aberystwyth to Chepstow, in church and community schools, are following an 18 month programme with twilight sessions and a residential at the Vale Resort. A key aspect of what we offer is the opportunity to be mentored by a senior leader in another school and have a bespoke professional learning experience. A number of our first cohort have gained promotion either within their own school or in other church schools. Evaluations of the course by participants have been very positive and encouraging:
